Anything Floats Race

RULES

Participants:

- Participants must be 13 years of age or older.
- All crew members are required to wear US Coast Guard approved life jackets.

Crafts:

- All crafts must be home-made and powered by hand or foot.
- Vessels built from kits, i.e. canoes etc. are not permitted.
- Blow up mattresses will be allowed if decorated.
- Every craft must have a name on it that is clearly visible during the race.

Craft Inspection @9:00-10:30AM:

- Inspection of crafts will be held at the Front Street Boat launch near the Boiling Springs Pool from 9:00-10:30 am.
- An event official will inspect all crafts to verify they are floatable and free of sharp edges, protruding metal, or any other unsafe materials.

Check-In 10:30AM:

- All entries must check-in by 10:30 am at the judges' stand located by the Trail House (next to TCO Fly Shop).

Race Information:

- The first race will begin at 11:00 am starting with the 1-person inter-tube race. 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 person races to follow in that order.
- Contestants may compete in multiple races so long as the craft is still floatable.
- Race heats will be assigned following check in.
- Each race will not have more than 6 teams in a heat.
- Teams will line up at the start / finish buoy, proceed straight ahead to the turn-around buoy, turn left and return to the start finish buoy. An official will be at the turn around buoy to verify all contestants move around the buoy.
- All crew members must be in/on craft when they cross the finish line.
- Crew members are responsible for the cleanup of all trash and debris made by their craft.
- Teams cannot physically interfere or come in contact on purpose with any opponents' craft before, during, or after the race. Teams found to be in violation will be disqualified.

Prizes:

- Prizes will be awarded following the final race of the day.
- A special prize will be awarded to the "most unique craft" and "most enthusiastic group".
